The Baby Grand piano that you see in the sanctuary has been gifted to Middleburg Church by my sister, Jurleen (Van Der Zwaag) Koele. The piano was gift that she received from her late husband, Harlan Koele, in 1992.

She chose to gift the piano to Free Grace Reformed because our roots go deep here. Our paternal grandmother, Anna (Dykstra) Van Der Zwaag was a child when the church was founded in 1885. Our maternal grandfather, Frank Bomgaars, played the trombone in the Middleburg Band in 1912.

Our lives as the four daughters of Elmer and Sal Van Der Zwaag (Jurleen, Sharon, Francine & Jolynn) revolved around this church from baptism, to Sunday School and catechism, to our Professions of Faith, to our weddings, which took place in this sanctuary.

Due to the death of Jur's husband, on October 3, 2021, and due to her physical health needs, Jurleen has moved to an assisted living community in Sioux City. Her wish is that the piano will be used to glorify God, rather than just being admired as a beautiful piece of furniture!
